



MEDIA WORKSHOP COMMUNICATION OF THE IMPACT OF CLIMATE CHANGE IN THE OCEAN: KNOWLEDGE, TOOLS AND PERSPECTIVES

June, 6-8, 2025 | European Digital Ocean Pavilion run by Mercator Ocean International (Nice, France)

Over 100 weather presenters from 74 countries will gather in Nice for the Media Workshop, the flagship event of the International Weather and Climate Forum, organized since 2004.

The theme of this year's event is "Ocean and Climate", and it is being held in conjunction with the Third United Nations Conference on the Oceans (UNOC), which will take place a few days later in Nice. The workshop will take place in the European Digital Ocean Pavilion, coordinated by Mercator Ocean International.

Forming trusted voices on climate

Round tables, hands-on workshops and exchanges with international scientists will enable participants to explore :

- the complex interactions between ocean and climate,
- the contribution of digital scientific data to a better understanding of current changes,
- innovative strategies for communicating these issues to the public in a clear, impactful and engaging way.



An annual event of international stature

For over 20 years, this unique workshop has brought together experts in meteorology, climatology and Earth observation to promote global media mobilization on climate issues. The 2025 edition, in the run-up to the UNOC, will mark a key moment in the mobilization of the media on ocean and climate issues, in a spirit of international cooperation and knowledge sharing.
